

Club code of conduct

Sportsmanship on the Pitch

- i. We play hard to win but play fair and as safe as possible.
- ii. We respect our opponents: magnanimous in victory and generous and dignified in defeat.
- iii. We respect and support umpires on and off the pitch, acknowledging that they, like us, can make mistakes.
- iv. We don't intimidate, threaten, swear or make inappropriate gestures, even if provoked.
- v. We abide by the GB Hockey policies and procedures for Safeguarding and Protecting Young People and Equality and Diversity.

Clubmanship: supporting each other and the club on and off the pitch

- i. We know that our contribution to sportsmanship and the club includes entertaining visiting teams.
- ii. We willingly play our part in off-the-pitch activities such as keeping our pitches clean and tidy, working on social events and other projects.
- iii. We respect the work that coaches and other volunteers do for us and the club. We volunteer to help with junior coaching etc when asked.
- iv. We commit to attending at least two club social functions per season.
- v. We pay our subscriptions on time.
- vi. We actively encourage parents of younger players to watch, take part in club socials and to volunteer their assistance and expertise.
- vii. We help the club to recruit new players of all standards.
- viii. We promote a positive but fair view of the Club to other members and clubs and to county, league and England Hockey.
- ix. We understand that the club will act in the best interests of all its members.
- If we have any questions of concerns, we raise these with our captain or another committee member.
- x. We read the Principles of Play and ask if we do not understand them.

No surprises with selection or availability

- i. We recognise that we want the strongest teams each week and that we may not play in every match.
- ii. We will play for the side for which we're selected.
- iii. We give our captain and coach maximum warning of when we are not available in order to help them and so they can include us whenever we are available.
- iv. We strive to give our captain more than a week's notice that we are not available.
- v. We can expect that our Coach / Captains will explain either before the team lists are published, as to if/why we are not selected or selected for a different from usual team.
- vi. We accept that our selection for matches will be influenced by how often we go to training, away game attendance, consistency of availability, standard of play or if we make ourselves unavailable at short notice.
- vii. We do not expect to play equal minutes to all players.

England Hockey Code of Conduct for Players

- i. Respect the spirit of fair play in hockey. This is more than playing within the rules.
- It also incorporates the concepts of friendship, respect for others and always participating with the right spirit.
- ii. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- iii. Respect umpires, officials, coaches, players and spectators.
- iv. Conduct ourselves in a manner that takes all reasonable measures to protect their own safety and the safety of others.
- v. Never participate when under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- vi. Promote the reputation of the sport and take all possible steps to prevent it from being brought into disrepute.
- vii. Accept success and failure, victory and defeat, with dignity.
- viii. Set a positive example for others, particularly young participants and spectators.
- ix. Protect others involved in the game from verbal or physical abuse and threatening or intimidating behaviour.
- x. Never use inappropriate language or gestures.
- $xi.\ Abide\ by\ the\ England\ Hockey\ Safeguarding\ and\ Protecting\ Young\ People\ in\ Hockey,\ Policy\ and\ Procedures\ and\ Good\ Practice\ Guidelines.$

As a parent or spectator:

- i. I will not force my child to participate in sports.
- ii. I will inform the coach of any physical disability or ailment that may affect the safety of my child or the safety of others.
- iii. I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.
- iv. I will deliver my child to, and collect from, the pitch area. If another responsible person is to collect/transport my child I will inform the Truro Hockey Club coaches/captains.
- v. I will respect the officials and their authority and, if necessary, will take time to speak to coaches at an agreed time and place. Usually at the end of the coaching session.

Frequently Asked Questions

When do we train?

Check our lovely website for info!

Do we pay match fees?

No! It's all covered in your membership fees

Where do we have post match teas?

Riverside Tapyard (The Old Skinner's Brewery) Newham Road TR1 2DP Truro, UK

Are post match teas free?

Yes and you get 10% off all drinks when you show the club buzz app.



Do we arrive to training early?

Yes! Always get to training 15mins early and warm up so that you're ready for stick and ball straight away.

Are all coaches & captains first aid trained and DBS checked?

Yes! All captains and Lead Coaches are DBS checked. Most have completed coaching courses, safeguarding courses and we always have at least one first aider at every session or game.

How do I sign up?

Via the website. Just follow the prompts and we will approve your applications

Can I have a go before deciding to join?

Yes! Come to training and see how you get on and if hockey at Truro HC is for you.

Can my payments be made in small amounts?

Yes! You can pay in smaller chunks. For example x4 quarterly amounts.

My child has been asked to play for a different team. Should they?

Absolutely. The coaches and captains are always discussing progressing players. If they've been selected for a team this is what's best for them and that team for that weekend. Sometimes we want to stretch and challenge them and sometimes we want them enjoying lots of minutes and touches on the ball.

Do we need fuel money for away games?

Offering your driver some fuel money is always a good idea. Usually £5 each is enough to cover it unless its a very long journey.

Frequently Asked Questions

If I'm asked for availbility by different captains on Club Buzz on the same week, should I say yes to all?

Yes! They will then decide, based on everyone's availability, which team to select.

Are playing shirts provided?

Yes. Each team has their own set of shirts. But if you want to buy your own - you can.

What shorts and socks do we wear?

The women's side wear black shorts or skorts. Men's side wear white shorts. Both men and women's side wear white socks.

Where can I purchase kit?

You can purchase all branded kit on the Y1 shop - you'll find links on our website. Non-branded items of the same colour are absolutely fine and can be purchased from any sports shop.

What protection does my child need?

For outfield players all players MUST wear shin pads and we strongly recommend gum shields or mouth guards when both playing and training.

Additional protection such as gloves are a good idea to protect hands from knocks and scrapes but aren't essential. Players are also encouraged to provide their own Penalty Corner Masks - although we will have these available for match days and when we coach penalty corners.

What length stick do I need to buy my child?

Often this comes down to personal preference but the rule of thumb for children is that it is approximately hip height. Some players prefer a longer stick and some a slightly shorter one.

Do we always play our home games at the same pitch?

Pretty much - yes! All training sessions and home games are held at Truro School and showers are in the Sir Ben Ainslie Leisure Centre.

Do I need to wait pitchside while my child trains?

No we will have your details and can call you if needs be. Just keep your phone on you and remain reachable.

Can I link more than one account to a single ClubBuzz account for my family?

Yes - this should happen automatically but if for any reason it does not you can contact members@trurohc.co.uk then we will be able to help you.


